We have managed to do some interesting well attended walks through the winter months, and hopefully the same for the spring programme.

The not so good news is that a recent report by Ramblers, showed there are 32,000 access restrictions on rights of way in 2023. This is a 4,000 increase from 2022. This clearly indicates why we should all do what we can to keep footpaths open, whether it is walking them physically, working on them, or writing/ notifying local authorities.

We do have a small core of volunteers who work on footpath clearance activities, updating signage, etc. As the days get longer and with improvements in the weather, we hope to become more active and we would welcome more to join us. It's not as onerous as it sounds.

We have our AGM on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March, preceded by a brief presentation by Jim Day, New Forest National Park Ranger starting at 7.30. Please make every effort to attend.

On a much more positive note, this year we celebrate 50 years since our society was founded. To recognize this, we are planning a celebratory lunch at the Old Beams on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May, with a guest speaker. We would like as many people as possible to join in this celebration. ### **Path News**

The route of the proposed diversion of a section of Fordingbridge Footpath 7 has been visited twice by our Chairman. He found that the section we had objected to because of inadequate drainage has now had drainage pipes installed, which seems to have solved the problem. The other minor problems involving a water pipe on the path surface and a step down onto a vehicle track have also been improved and the path on the ground now agrees with the map of the proposed diversion.

Two paths remain closed due to bridge problems. One is on Ringwood Footpath 35b at the junction with Ringwood Footpath 40 and the other is on the Avon Valley Path from Bickerley Common to Hampshire Hatches. The boardwalk on E.H.&I. Footpath 707 From Highwood Lane to Rockford Common is also closed. It is possible to walk this path without using the boardwalk, but the mud is so deep I doubt that anyone would. Most members of the public continue to walk these paths at their own risk, but we cannot use them as members of the Footpath Society, as our insurance would not be valid.

Bill Morley and Mike Osborne have continued to carry out surveys, mainly of culverts under Rights of Way, but also on the state of the Rights of Way. They have encountered many problems, some of which seem to be software related to the surveying system, as well as the usual problems with signage, gates & stiles. In Hyde they have come across a number of fingerposts that do not seem to be HCC ones indicating Rights of Way that do not exist and/or fail to show those that do. We have not determined who erected the above posts, but will endeavor to correct them using Waymark Disks.

Surveying has been very limited, as many of our routes are impassable due to deep water, which obviously is bad for walkers as well as surveyors. Let us hope we have a dry Spring and can enjoy walking in more of our local countryside.


