We have had the hottest and driest summer for many years, probably since 1976, when I was still at university! I hope you have all coped with it.

I am pleased to say that we have had another full walk programme well attended even through the heat waves. Particular highlights being the walk at Cranbourne finishing at the Sixpenny brewery for a drink and pizza, and also our second summer solstice walk, where the weather was kind to us yet again, and followed by breakfast at Woodfalls Inn.

We also had a walk up to our freshly repainted trig point (thanks Mike Pearce) which was well attended though sadly some could not make it. Thanks to Denise and all the leaders, but as ever we would like more to come forward to lead walks.

We again had a stand at the Ellingham show this year, and we looked a lot more professional with the new banner and flag, but still have some work to do on upgrading our presentation material. The weather was near perfect and we had a steady stream of visitors, distributed many fliers/membership forms and hopefully some will follow-up and join. As ever we had a number of complaints and issues raised by the public, some of which we were already aware of but we will be following up on them with HCC. There is a lot of work setting up and manning the stall, so many thanks to all who helped.

Work continues on surveying the condition of footpaths in our parishes, we have been focusing on the Damerham/Sandleheath area, and have been in contact with a Damerham parish councillor who has a special remit for paths in their parish.

We continue to work on clearing overgrown paths, and have worked mainly on sections of AVP including the leg from Fordingbridge to Bickton and also clearing paths behind Braemore cricket club. In addition, we have had further discussions with HCC, and for those who expressed an interest in the footpath warden scheme and group working parties we are arranging an introduction/induction event in September.



For the next quarter we have organised two outside speakers on the following: - Monday 13th October a talk on "George Heywood Sumner" an artist, naturalist and archaeologist who lived near Fordingbridge by Jeremy Houghton Brown.

Followed on Monday 10th November with a talk on "Winter in the New Forest" by Marcus Ward of Wild New Forest. These talks will be open

to non RFFS members to try and help boost revenues.

Finally, our next special event is the Bring and Share Summer Lunch on 31st August at Godshill village hall. This will be preceded by a short walk for those who wish to, and has gone down really well in the past so we hope you can attend.

Path News

Unfortunately, I have only been able to carry out very limited work in my role as Footpath Secretary and am very grateful to Mike Osborne for stepping in to cover most of the work.

Our Chairman Bill Morley has continued to organize cutting parties to keep overgrown paths clear and to work with Mike on surveys.

Paul Howland of Ramblers is continuing to submit claims for many historic paths in our parishes, that are not classified as Rights of Way. The considerable searching for evidence from many sources must almost be a full-time job.

We have disappointing news, in that there are now no viable crossings of Dockens Water from the Roadway at Moyles Court to Woodford Bottom, which is on Crown land and not a Right of Way. Even this eastern crossing is very difficult to use and it connects to the southern end of Footpaths 9,10 &14. HCC had agreed with Ramblers to maintain at least one of the crossings Footpath 717 in exchange for Ramblers suspending the court action against HCC, for failing to maintain Footpath 19.

We have other Rights of Way that are unusable because of fencing and hedges being planted along the line of the path, as well as other temporary closures, but none were as well used as Ellingham Footpath 717.

The AVP south of Ringwood has been closed for a long time, for what seems to be a relatively minor repair.

It is regrettable that over the last few years there has been a deterioration of many of the paths in our parishes. Let us hope that things improve somewhat and are not badly affected by the pending local government changes.
